## **BEST PRACTICES FOR PIE CHARTS**

A quick guide to help keep your pie charts honest and easy to consume


A pie chart displays the percent or proportion of total for each category.

All slices should add up to 100%.




It's difficult to compare the size of the triangular slices.

Use a bar/column chart when the data has **small variances** between categories.




Weep the number of slices to a minimum.
Usually 4-6 slices max. Too many slices makes the chart difficult to read.




Don't use multiple pie charts to make comparisons over time.

Line charts can be a good alternative.




5 Don't use 3D pie charts, ever.
The size of the slices is deceiving. Chart does not accurately represent the data.



The size of the 13% slice is larger than 15% because it is in the foreground.

Avoid the Legend

This makes the chart slower to read. Add category labels on/outside the chart instead.





7 Use pie charts sparingly, when the data meets the rules above. Do your best to educate your boss & audience about the principles of data visualization, but don't get too upset when their demand for pie charts wins.
